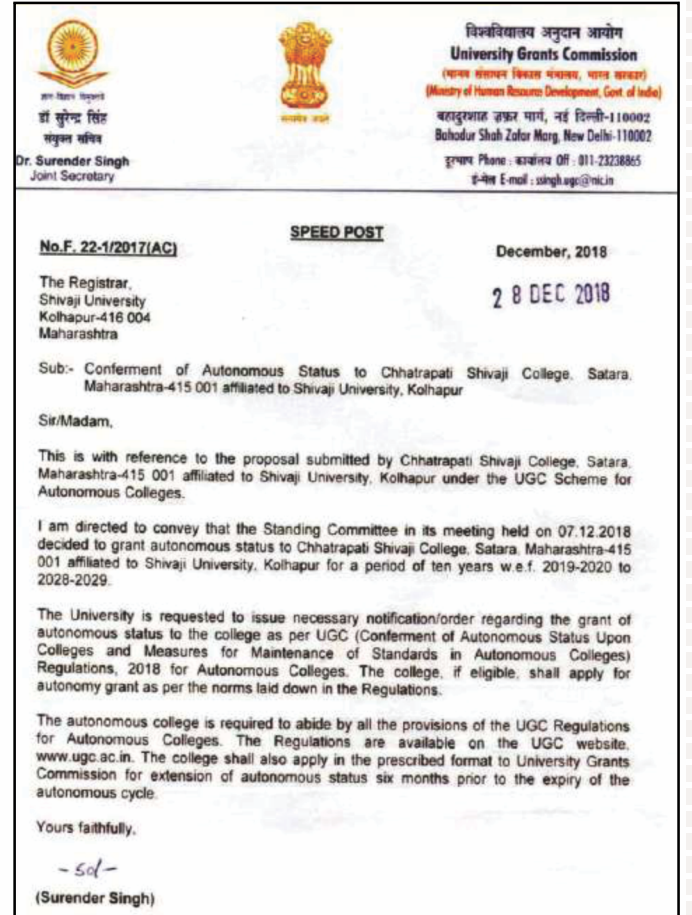

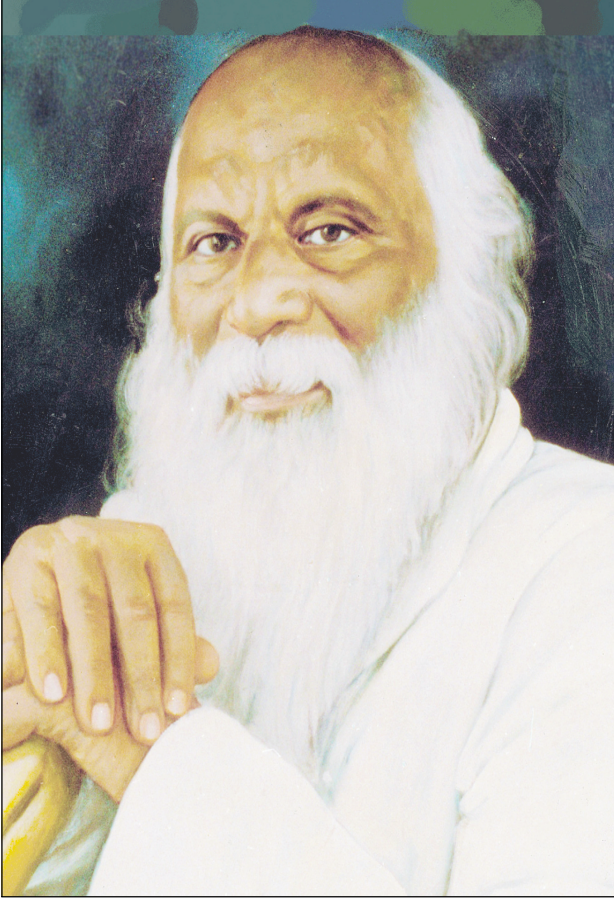

The UGC, New Delhi has conferred on the college autonomous status from the academic year 2019-2020. Under autonomy from 2019 the college has brought a change in the syllabus by introducing various skills useful for employability.

The college executes the curriculum effectively. It has upgraded teaching-learning and evaluation. It has enhanced the research potential of faculty and students. The student centric activities have supported the students and also resulted into their progression towards further education. The NCC and NSS units try to nurture various abilities of students. The learning resources and infrastructure have played crucial role in the development of the college. The college has followed the policy of inclusive education through its 'Earn and Learn Scheme'. The infrastructure is developed as per the needs and the availabilities of funds to make the learning resources rich. The high number of merit holders and rankers reflects the outcomes of teaching, learning, evaluation. From its inception 803 students are selected through Prin. Mrs. Sumatibai Patil and Prin. Barr. ABOUT THE COLLEGE :

Chhatrapati Shivaji College is the first of the Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, established in 1947 by the founder of the Sanstha, Late Padmabhushan Dr. Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil. The opening of it was a great social event as it was going to provide higher education to the youths from the mofussil areas of Maharashtra. Karmaveer Anna opened this college as the first centre of higher education for poor and needy students. The college laid stress on a very novel kind of educational philosophy. The college introduced a unique 'Earn and Learn Scheme' for students to earn their education. Our college is one of the biggest single faculty Arts College in Maharashtra.

The college offers ten undergraduate and ten postgraduate programmes along with several new self-financing short term, University and Govt. courses on the campus. The college is accredited in the Third Cycle of accreditation at 'A+' grade by National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore with CGPA of 3.51 in 2017. The UGC, New Delhi has conferred on the college autonomous status from the academic year 2019-2020. Our College is a constituent college of Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil University, Satara from 2021-22

About Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil University, Satara: Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil intended to have rural University. The dream came in true in the form of Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil University, Satara on 2021 by the Govt. of Maharashtra under the RUSA scheme in 2021. There are three constituent Colleges of the University named as Yashwantrao Chavan Institute of Science, Dhananjayrao Gadgil College of Commerce and Chhatrapati Shivaji College, Satara having various programmes in Science and Technology, Humanities, Commerce and Management.

About Rayat Shikshan Sanstha Satara: Rayat Shikshan Sanstha is one of the largest and leading educational institutes in India founded by the eminent educationist and social reformer Padmabhushan Dr. Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil in the year 1919 at village Kale in Karad tahsil. The Sanstha has contributed immensely to educate masses in Maharashtra. Social justice, humanity, equality are the ideologies cherished by the Sanstha. At present, the Sanstha is operating through the network of 736 branches including 1 University, 43 colleges, of which 7 colleges having autonomous status. It provides education over 4.5 lakh students through the workforce of more than 13,000 employees'.

About YC College, Satara : Since its inception in 1965, Yashwantrao Chavan Institute of Science has continued the legacy of the Sanstha for the last fifty years and has imparted quality science education to the society. During these last fifty years, the Institute has not only scaled academic heights but also made its impact felt at state and national level with A+ grade with CGPA 3.57 in third cycle accreditation by NAAC, Bangalore. Since October 2021 this college became the Constituent College of Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil University, Satara.

About DG College, Satara : It is a matter of great pride to convey that, this is the first Commerce College in the jurisdiction of Shivaji University that enjoys Academic Autonomy since June 2016. The college has attained UGC-CPE status and recertified ISO 9001-2015. This college with 'A+' Grade with 3.61 CGPA in third cycle of assessment and accreditation. This college is ranked as 110th by NIRF in 2017. Since October 2021 this college became the Constituent College of Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil University, Satara.

SPECIAL FEATURES :

'EARN AND LEARN SCHEME' : 'The Manual Labour Scheme' is an outstanding feature of the college. The Scheme facilitates the poor and needy students with free and residential education, inculcating in them dignity of labour, secular outlook, co-operation and mutual understanding. The students have to do manual work in agriculture, dairy, canteen, laundry, flourmill etc. The women students too have been benefitting from this scheme since last 19 years. The students desiring to take admission to the Manual Labour Scheme have to contact the Principal and seek it before 1 July. The application forms are available in the office.

LIBRARY : The central library of the college, full-fledged one, administers the academic needs of students and teachers. It has rich collection of the textbooks and reference books. The library treasures 1,42,728 books and the number is increasing every year.

Its journal section includes a good number of national and international journals, useful ones for the scholars engaged in research work.

The students have to apply for the Identity Cards. No students can enjoy the library facility without it. They must have their Identity Cards with them whenever on the campus. This will be treated as a matter of discipline. The student can borrow books twice a week.

BOOK BANK SCHEME : The library provides book-bank facility to students. Every year good number of students get benefit from it. The needy students can borrow the sets of the text books from the library by depositing 25% of the total amount of their original prices.

STUDY HALL: The study hall with AC remains open from 7.00 a.m. to 10.00 p.m.

GYMKHANA: The college provides special attention to the sport potential of the students. It has well-furnished Gymkhana of its own. The indoor games, such as Badminton, Judo, Taekwondo, Boxing, Mat Wrestling, Malakhamb, Table-Tennis and outdoor games such as Athletics, Volleyball, Cricket, Kho-kho and Kabaddi etc. are supervised and coached by the Physical Director of the college.

NCC: NCC training is available for the students of this college from 1954. It was developed into 22 Maharashtra Battalion in 1960. This battalion has been affiliated to Kolhapur group. Each year 105 cadets are enrolled for the NCC training. The NCC officer encourages the cadets to prepare for 'B' and 'C' Certificate Examinations.

NSS: The NSS unit started in 1969 has become a special feature of this college. It offers various extension services with regard to social and cultural development of the community by creating a unique kind of social commitment among students. Our college has three units having more than 300 students enrolled.

Our college and our NSS unit have been awarded the First Prize by the Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

HOSTELS: The college hostels located in the premises provide accommodation to students. In the Men's Hostel Lodging and boarding facilities are provided to the student of Earn and Learn Scheme.

The Women's Hostel provides both the facilities.

The Principal is the final authority regarding the hostel admissions and the matters of discipline.

CHHATRAPATI SHIVAJI MILITARY ACADEMY:

Is started from 2019 to train students for recruitments in Indian Army, Central Para military force and state police.

B. VOC. (MEDIA AND ENTERTAINMENT)

Chhatrapati Shivaji College, Satara has always been at the forefront of imparting skill-based education along with traditional education. As a part of this, in 2018 B. Voc. in Media and Entertainment a degree course was started. India has seen a huge increase in the number of television channels in the public and private sectors, but there is a huge shortage of manpower with the background and skills required to work in the sector, such as TV, Film, Radio, New Media, Video Production, etc. This is a golden opportunity for students who want to pursue a career in the field.

PRIN. SUMATIBAI PANDURANG PATIL & PRIN. BARRISTER P. G. PATIL COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS GUIDANCE CENTRE:

The Competitive Examinations Guidance Centre is the asset of the college. It is run by the parent institution, Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, Satara. Our teachers take every effort to widen its scope and activities. The regular guidance classes for MPSC and UPSC examination are conducted. The interactions with experts are regularly organised. The unit tests and the group discussions on current topics are also held.

The Centre has its own internet connected library and study room. The library provides the guidance material in the form of books, magazines and journals for different competitive examinations of Railways, L.I.C., C.D.S., Banking etc. 701 students of the centre are selected for various posts through M.P.S.C. examination since its establishment.

YOUTH FESTIVAL: Our students have won many prizes at zonal and the University level competitions. In the youth festival. We encourage students to participate in the cultural activities. The college has kept the tradition of making a high impression in Youth Festival.

FRESHIP / CONCESSIONS :

- **Government of India [GOI] Freeships [SC/ST/NT/OBC/SBC Students]**
- who have passed last examination and whose annual income of Parents / Guardians is More than Rs. 2,00,000/- for SC/ST students. More than Rs. 1,00,000/- but not more than 6,00,000/- for NT/VJ/OBC/SBC Students.
- Economically Backward Class [EBC] Fee concession is given to students. The annual income of parents should not be more than Rs. 1,00,000/- per annum.
- PTC/STC Concession - Fee concession is given to the ward of Primary and Secondary School Teacher.
- Ex-Serviceman Concession - Fee concession is given to Ex-Serviceman's Son/Daughter/Wife/Widow.
- Sanstha Sevak Concession - Fee concession is given to a Son / Daughter / Wife / Widow of an employee of Rayat Shikshan Sanshta, Satara.

SCHOLARSHIPS :

- **Government of India [GOI] Scholarship for SC / ST / NT / OBC / SBC Students**
For SC and ST students who have passed the last Examination. The annual income of their Parents / Guardians should not be more than Rs.2,00,000/- For NT/VJ/OBC/SBC Students. The annual income of their parents' / guardians' should not be more than Rs.1,00,000/-
- **National/State/Central Sector Scheme:**
Scholarship to students Who have passed H.S.C. examination securing more than 60% marks.
- **Divyang (Physically Handicapped) Scholarship:**
The student who are physically handicapped must produce a certificate by the Civil Surgeon concerned [Minimum 40% disability.]
- **Post Matric Scholarship for students of Minority Community:**
The minority students who have secured not less than 50% marks and annual income of whose parents/guardians from all sources does not exceed Rs. 2,00,000/-. 30% seats are reserved for women students.
